Fibre-Enabled Broadband update

As reported previously an order has been placed with Openreach to upgrade cabinet 32 (located on Hartopp Road near the tennis club). This will significantly improve broadband speeds for those houses served by this cabinet and the latest update from Openreach suggests the upgrade will be completed over summer.

Footpath & Verge Improvement Plan

Under this plan improvements to significant stretches of Bracebridge Road have recently been carried out. The verges have been repaired and the footpaths recovered with Breedon gravel. Works of this nature will be ongoing, subject to funding and prioritisation.

Two of the directors will be 'walking' the entire Estate again shortly to ensure that the areas most in need of improvement are identified and prioritised.

Also under this plan pavements in The Moorlands and Knowles Drive are about to be replaced.

Neighbourhood Watch scheme - Hartopp Road

A Neighbourhood Watch scheme to cover Hartopp Road (and the cul-de-sacs that run off it) is in the process of being set up. Clare Horrocks, who is a resident, has initiated this and will be taking on the role of co-ordinator. Neighbourhood Watch is probably well known to you and the scheme has been running for many years. The first Neighbourhood Watch scheme was launched in 1982 and local schemes are organised on a road-by-road basis. If anyone is prepared to consider acting as the co-ordinator for 'their' road please let me know and I will pass your details to the local Police Community Support Officer who would then contact you.

Grounds Maintenance matters

Upkeep of the verges is an ongoing and difficult exercise as they are commonly damaged by inconsiderate parking and commercial vehicles, including refuse vehicles, delivery lorries and vans. Our grounds maintenance contractors regularly repair this damage to keep the verges as neat as possible. In addition the Estate is mechanically swept around every six weeks with additional sweeps after adverse weather.

The orange bag scheme for 'green waste' has proved extremely popular with residents and around 700 bags are removed weekly weighing around five tons.
